Whereas the **Settler** is desirous of establishing a trust of the Professionals of the Physical Education for public charitable objects of Health / Physical Education / Sports Sciences / Inter-disciplinary Research and Studies in Health / Physical Education / Sports Sciences and whereas the trustees have, at the request of the settler, agreed to act as the first trustees of these presents as testified by their being parties to the executing these presents.

NOW THIS DEED OF TRUST WITNESSETH AS UNDER :

The Author has this day endowed a sum of Rs.1,000/- (Rupees One Thousand Only) with the trustees appointed under the terms of this deed to constitute as it's corpus contribution, which sum the trustees shall hold together with further accretions thereto and such other assets which the trust may acquire, from time to time, for the objects set out herein below.

1. NAME OF THE TRUST

The name of the Trust shall be the, **“ALL INDIA COUNCIL FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION”**

2. REGISTERED OFFICE

The Registered office of the Trust shall be in Delhi and or in any part of the Union of India as may be decided upon by the trustees from time to time. At present, the registered office of the Trust shall be located at the following address: **RZ-192-A, Dharampura –I, Kakrola Road, Nazafgarh, New Delhi - 110043**

3. LOCATION / JURISDICTION

The Trust shall function in Delhi and or in any part of the Union of India as may be decided upon by the trustees from time to time.

4. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aim and objectives of the Trust are as under: -

Health Education, 12. History of Physical Education and Sport, 13. International Curriculum Standards and Development, 14. Legal Liability in HPERSD, 15. Leisure and Recreation, 16. - 5.5. To encourage the interest of the boys and girls in Physical Education / Fitness / Games / Sports/ Yoga / Gymnastic by organizing the sport and games competition / tournament on Village / Block / District / State / National and International level and also offer the prizes, certificates and awards to the winners.
- 6.6. To take disciplinary action against any member for acts of indiscipline, unfair affiliation in tournaments.
- 7.7. To arrange physical training exercise through GYM and provide all kinds of services, consultancy and all required facilities to the boys, girls, men and women in the backward, rural, tribal, urban and industrial areas of the country with latest technology and modern equipments and with the trained instructors/coaches.
- 8.8. To pass an appropriate act like, “All India Council for Physical Education Act” to take all such steps or suggest to the Central Government or State Governments as it may think fit for ensuring planned and co-ordinated development of, “teacher education” in Physical Education and for the determination and maintenance of standards for, “teacher education” in Physical Education and for the purposes of performing its functions under this Act, the Council may –
 - (a) undertake surveys and studies relating to various aspects of teacher education in Physical Education various interdisciplinary research and studies and publish the result thereof;
 - (b) make recommendations to the Central and State Government, Universities, University Grants Commission and recognised institutions in the matter of preparation of suitable plans and programmes in the field of teacher education in Physical Education;
 - (c) co-ordinate and monitor teacher education in Physical Education and its development in the country;
 - (d) lay down guidelines in respect of minimum qualifications for a person to be employed as a teacher of Physical Education in schools or in recognised institutions;
 - (e) lay down norms for any specified category of courses or trainings in teacher education in Physical Education, including the minimum eligibility criteria for admission thereof, and the method of selection of candidates, duration of the course, course contents and mode of curriculum;

- (f) lay down guidelines for compliance by recognised institutions, for starting new courses or training, and for providing physical and instructional facilities, staffing pattern and staff qualification in Physical Education1. Adapted Physical Education, 2. Aerobics, 3. Aging, 4. Aquatics, 5. Coaching, 6. Comparative Physical Education and Sport 7. Computer Applications to HPERSD, 8. Dance and Dance Education, 9. - (g) lay down standards in respect of examinations leading to teacher education qualifications in Physical Education other above mentioned subjects, criteria for admission to such examinations and schemes of courses or training;
- (h) lay down guidelines regarding tuition fees and other fees chargeable by recognised institutions;
- (i) promote and conduct innovation and research in physical education various areas of teacher education related with physical education and other multidisciplinary subjects mentioned in and disseminate the results thereof;
- (j) examine and review periodically the implementation of the norms, guidelines and standards laid down by the Council, and to suitably advise the recognised institution;
- (k) evolve suitable performance appraisal system, norms and mechanism for enforcing accountability on recognised institutions;
- (l) formulate schemes for various levels of teacher education and identify recognised institutions and set up new institutions for teacher development programmes;

- (m) take all necessary steps to prevent commercialisation and exploitation of teacher of the Institutions / colleges / universities of teachers education in physical education and other faculties of physical education.
 - (n) perform such other functions as may be decided by the council with the coordinated effort or as may be entrusted to it by the Central Government.
- 9.9. To make inspection in the teachers' training institutions / colleges / universities for physical education and sports sciences in India and provide the proper professional guidance to the institutions / colleges / universities for better quality and vocational education in 1. Adapted Physical Education, 2. Aerobics, 3. Aging, 4. Aquatics, 5. Coaching, 6. Comparative Physical Education and Sport 7. Computer Applications to HPERSD, 8. Dance and Dance Education, 9. Fitness and Wellness, 10. Girls and Women in Sport, 11. Health Education, 12. History of Physical Education and Sport, 13. International Curriculum Standards and Development, 14. - (1) For the purpose of ascertaining whether the recognised physical education institutions / colleges / universities are functioning in accordance with the provision of this Act, the Council may cause inspection of any such institutions / colleges / universities, to be made by such person as it may direct, and in such manner as may be prescribed.
 - (2) The Council shall communicate to the institutions / colleges / universities the date on which inspection under sub-section (1) is to be made and the institution shall be entitled to be associated with the inspection in such manner as may be prescribed.
 - (3) The Council shall communicate to the said institutions / colleges / universities, its views in regard to the results of any such inspection and may, after ascertaining the opinion of that institution, recommend to that institution the action to be taken as a result of such inspection.

- (4) All communications to the institutions / colleges / universities under this section shall be made to the executive authority thereof, and the executive authority of the institution shall report to the Council the action, if any, which is proposed to be taken for the purpose of implementing any such recommendation as is referred to in sub-section (3).
- 10.10. To establish a Cell/Board to provide the Registration facilities for the various Gym/HEALTH CARE CENTRES to diffuse the useful knowledge their rights by peaceful representation.
- 11.11. To receive financial and non financial assistance from Govt./Non Govt./ Organisation, International Agencies, banks and any other legal entity or individual.
- 12.12. To accept donation, Grants presents gifts and other offerings in the shape of movable and/or immovable properties for the attainment of the aims and objectives.
- 13.13. To collect information, Notifications, Policies from the Government, Semi-Government, National/International Agencies and N.G.Os. and also provide the same to the general public.
- 14.14. To provide legal, medical aid, social economic help and assistance to the needy people, at free of cost.
- 15.15. To approach to the competent court/courts to safeguard the right of the general public and for the public interests from time to time as the Board of Trust may deem fit and proper.
- 16.16. To organize and raise funds and/or the donations towards the CM/PM Relief Funds.
- 17.17. To publish Books, Charts, Illustrations, Journals, Magazines, Periodicals, News Letter/Papers and other publications in the different languages and on the different subjects for the purpose of council.
- 18.18. To assist and co-operate the other Associations, Trusts and the various N.G.Os' whose aims are same like this Trust.
- 19.19. To do such other things/acts/activities, which are necessary and which may be incidental or conducive to the attainment of any other object of the Trust.
- 20.20. The Aims and Objects of the Trust shall be purely for 'CHARITABLE PURPOSE' which includes relief of the poor, educational, social, medical, relief and the advancement of any other objects of general public utility.
- 21.21. All the activities shall be Non Profitable and shall be done on 'No Profit-No Loss' basis.

22.22. The Trust will invest its money and funds according to the Section 11 of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

23.23. All the incomes, earnings, movables and immovable properties of the Trust shall be solely utilized and applied towards the promotion of its aims and objects only as mentioned in the memorandum of Trust and no profits thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus, profits or in any manners whatsoever to the present or past Trustees of the Trust to person claiming through any one or more of the present or the past Trustees. No Trustee of the Trust shall have any personal claims on any moveable or immovable properties of the Trust or make any profits whatsoever by virtue of his being a Trustee.

24.24. The benefits of the trust are open to all irrespective of caste, religion race, sex etc. that the trust will carry all its activities for the benefit of people in India and abroad.

5. THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

A Board of Trustees consisting of a minimum of three trustees but not exceeding Eleven Trustees at any given time and shall manage the Trust. The Board shall be constituted as per the Act passed by the founder trustees here in after will be known as, **“All India Council for Physical Education Act – 2008”**

6. POWERS OF THE TRUSTEES

The powers of the Board of Trustees are as under:-

- 6.1. To acquire, sell, either absolutely or under mortgage, lease, exchange, enter into a license arrangement or otherwise, any or all of the property of the Trust at any time, for such consideration or terms as the Trustees may, from time to time, seem fit.
- 6.2. To execute all necessary documents required for exercising power vested in the Board of Trustees and to secure fulfillment thereof.
- 6.3. To invest Trust funds in any property, whether moveable or immovable, as the Trustees may, from time to time determine. The Trustees shall ensure that the Trust funds are always invested in the permitted forms and modes in accordance with, and not violate, the provisions of section 11(5) of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- 6.4. To cancel, recall or vary all or any of the investments, as they deem fit.
- 6.5. To open, operate and close one or more the accounts with any one or more of the scheduled banks in any part of the Union of India.

- 6.6. To draw, accept, endorse, executed and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange and or any other negotiable or transferable instruments.
- 6.7. To borrow, raise money or accept any guarantee that may be required by the Trust upon such terms and conditions that the Trustees consider advisable.
- 6.8. To receive gifts, whether in cash or in kind requests, donations, contributions, endowments for individuals, charities, companies, societies or other trusts, on such terms and conditions as may be imposed by the donors and as the Trustees may consider fit in the best interests of the Trust.
- 6.9. To apply and or accumulate funds as the Trustees deem fit. To donate such sums, in cash or kind, as they may seem fit, to any charitable trust, institution, association or government body, having regard to the best interest and objects of the Trust.
- 6.10. To retain skilled professional or technical advisers in connection with the objects of the Trust and to pay them fees or remuneration as may be considered fair and reasonable.
- 6.11. To appoint personnel for any work connected with the affairs of the Trust and to suspend, discharge or remove such personnel. To define the duties and responsibilities of such personnel as and when the occasion arises. To consider matters such as the remuneration; terms and conditions of engagement and or employment.
- 6.12. To co-operate with other institutions or associations having objects similar to the objects of this Trust.
- 6.13. To institute, defend or compromise a legal or other proceedings concerning the Trust. For this purpose the Trustees are empowered to appoint advisers, consultants, advocates, lawyers and attorneys and fix their remuneration in accordance with their skills and duties engaged. The Trustees are also empowered to grant power of attorney for any representation, which may from time to time be necessary.
- 6.14. To apply to the Government, public bodies, urban, local municipal, district and other bodies, corporations, companies or other persons for and to accept grants or money, equipment, land, buildings, donations, gifts, subscriptions and other assistance with a view to promoting the objects of the Trust and to conform to the conditions on which such grants or other payments were received.

7. BOARD MEETINGS

- 7.1. The Board of Trustees shall meet regularly, at least once every three months, to consider matters relating to the management of the Trust. The Managing Trustee shall be the chairperson at such meeting unless other circumstances, which prevent his attendance, prevail.
- 7.2. In the event that the Managing Trustee is unable to attend, the Trustees attending the meeting, shall nominate one of their number to act as Chairperson for the meeting.
- 7.3. Minutes of all meetings shall be kept in the Minute Book and confirmed and signed by the Chairperson of the meeting that such minutes recorded are the true minutes of that meeting.

8. NOTICE OF BOARD MEETINGS

The Board is to give all Trustees fifteen days notice of meetings. Notice of meetings of Trustees can be given in writing or in any other verbal or electronic form. Such notice may be waived and or shortened, provided all Trustees entitled to be present and vote, so consider, and give approval to the Board of Trustees in writing, that due notice had been given of the meeting and all Trustees had an opportunity to attend the meeting. Meetings may be conducted by telephone, e-mail, Internet or other technical means including circulars, electronic media, and telephone or by other written or spoken media.

9. DURATION OF THE BOARD

- 9.1. All the trustees shall unless they voluntarily resign or otherwise decided to continue to be the trustees during the term of their lives.
- 9.2. The trustees shall be entitled at their discretion from time to time start, discontinue, abolish and restart any charity or charitable institution, to impose any condition or conditions to any subscriptions or donation made by them and to earmark any portion of the trust property or income for any particular object or objects.
- 9.3. The trustees may reimburse themselves and pay and discharge out of the trust fund all expenses incurred by them in or about the execution of the trust or any of their duties under these presents including reasonable traveling expenses, but will not be entitled for any remuneration.
- 9.4. Any trustees may retire at any time without assigning any reason and without being responsible for any cost occasioned by retirement.
- 9.5. The surviving or continuing Trustees may notwithstanding any vacancy in their body act as Trustees PROVIDED HOWEVER that if the number of Trustees shall fall below three the minimum fixed by these presents the

Trustees shall not (except for the purpose of filling any vacancy) act so long as the number is below the said minimum.

10. QUORUM OF BOARD MEETINGS

- 10.1. Three fourth Trustees shall form quorum for any General Body meeting of the trustees. Where as two third members of the Board shall form the quorum for the meeting of the Executive.
- 10.2. The number of trustees for the time being shall elect amongst them selves one chairman and he/she shall hold the office for five years, unless he resigns or refuses to act as chairman or otherwise ceases to be Trustees.
- 10.3. In case of difference of opinion among the Trustees the opinion of the majority shall prevail and if the trustees are equally divided in any matter, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 10.4. All proceedings, questions and matters arising at the meeting, of the trustees shall be decided by a majority of votes and in case of equality of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote PROVIDED HOWEVER that notwithstanding anything here-in-stated no question dealing with the disposal of the corpus of any of the trust properties and/or no question regarding acquisition of any properties and/or investment out of the Trust Corpus shall be decided except with the consent of the Chairman of the Trust.

11. BANK ACCOUNTS

The Bank Account of the Trust shall be opened and operated in any of the scheduled banks in Delhi and shall be operated by joint signature of Secretary General and Treasurer of the Board of Trust. However the Secretary General of the trust will be entitled to operate the account independently upto the amount not exceeding Rs.10, 000.00 (Rs. Ten Thousand Only) in the interest of trust or for the payment of the salary of the employees of the trust as decided and / or appointed by the Board of the trust from time to time.

12. DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Any Trustee whose actions, omissions, or behavior are found to be detrimental to the interest, objectives, goals, and vision of the Trust, or found contradictory to the Statements of this Trust, may be suspended or removed by the resolution approved by two-thirds majority of the board. Any Trustee who is divorced, morally failed, or caught in any financial embezzlement, is no longer worthy to be a trustee. A show cause notice shall be served on that Trustee under registered cover or courier. In the case of a reply not being received within two weeks from date of service on that Managing Trustee or Trustees, the Board will proceed in processing the show cause notice without waiting for the reply from that Managing Trustee or Trustees.

13. RULES & REGULATIONS

The Board of Trustees, by majority of two thirds if its members may amend or introduce new rules and regulations for the smooth and effective functioning, conduct, administration and overall management of the Trust. Such rules and regulations shall in no way conflict or be derogative to or tend to circumvent the objects and purposes of the Trust.

14. AUDITING

The Financial Statements of the Trust shall be prepared monthly by the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees. The annual financial Statements of the Trust shall be audited by a qualified auditor. Such auditor shall be Chartered Accountant or a member of a firm of Chartered Accountants appointed by the General Body. The first financial year will end on 31st March of every financial year.

15. FUNDS OF THE TRUST

The Trust Funds shall comprise of the initial contribution of Rs.1,000/ (Rupees One Thousand Only) endowed this day by the Author of the Trust, membership contributions of the trust, as well as all voluntary contributions the Trust may receive from time to time, the realization of its assets, accretions thereto, borrowings made from time to time, and other such receipts that may accrue to the Trust, in the course of its carrying in its activities, inspection fees received by the Institutions / colleges / universities of the various courses being run in furtherance of its objects as per the rules and All India Council of Physical Education Act - 2008.

16. APPLICATION OF TRUST INCOME AND FUNDS

16.1. The income and funds of the Trust, however so derived, shall be applied solely towards the objects of the Trust, as set forth in this Deed. No portion thereof shall be utilized for payment to the Trustees in their individual capacity as remuneration, interest, salary, compensation or honorarium as a Trustee of this Trust. Nothing prevents the Trust from reimbursing a Trustee for any bonafide expenditure incurred by the Trustee on behalf of the Trust in carrying out the objects of the Trust.

16.2. No trustee of the Trust shall have any personal claim on any movable or immovable property of the Trust or claim any profits, whatsoever, by virtue of his/her trusteeship.

17. IRREVOCABLE

The Trust constituted herein shall be irrevocable.

18. DISSOLUTION

In the event of the Board of Trustees resolving to dissolve the Trust, the assets and properties of the Trust shall be transferred to another Trust, Society or Institution having similar objects as that of this Trust.

19. PROCEEDING OF THE TRUST

Any defect in the constitution of the Trust shall not invalidate its proceedings

20. RESIDUARY

For matters not provided for in these presents, the provisions of the Indian Trust Act and the Income Tax Act, 1961 and rules made there under will apply accordingly.
